Crop Report By Ron Becker, Wayne County Report 10-11-06 Harvest is continuing in the field for peppers, sweet corn, zucchini, cucumbers and fall crops such as pumpkins, gourds, winter squash and Indian Corn. In high tunnels, tomatoes are still being harvested and some growers are giving thought to putting in lettuce. The quality of pumpkins has been very good with little rot either in the field or short term storage. What problems are being found in pumpkins and winter squash are symptoms from viruses (bumpy fruit or rings on the fruit). Downy mildew is causing problems in some late plantings of cauliflower. Fall planted cauliflower is also tending to be 1-2 weeks behind in development. In some cases this has been due to late planting. But in other fields that were planted the same time as in previous years, development has been slower than normal.
